Getting Started

- If frozen allow 2-3 days thawing in the refrigerator.
- Remove the country ham from the refrigerator45 minutes before heating.
- Remove all packing from country ham including plastic film, and bone guard.
- Pre-heat oven to 350 °F.

Quick and Easy Method

- 1. Line roasting pan with large sheet of foil. (Makes clean up easier later)
- 2. Place country ham in roasting pan with flat surface down.

* Optional steps

- *Pierce country ham with a paring knife parallel to the bone and insert cloves. I usually do about 5-7 places.
- *Separate some spiral slices and place bay leaves in between. (5 to 7 places)
- 3.Tent foil around country ham.
- 4. Place in pre-heat (350°F) oven for 40 minutes.
- 5. After 40 minutes remove country ham from oven.
- 6. Pat brown sugar on to country ham and place back in oven on broil. This usually takes about 3-5 minutes for the brown sugar to caramelize.
- 7. Remove country ham from the oven and let cool for 10 minutes.

How to cut, slice and serve spiral sliced country ham.

- 1. Place country ham on cutting board with the meaty side up. Bone parallel of cutting board.
- 2. insert a thin blade knife around the outside of the bone. while holding ham with carving fork.
- 3. Make a knife cut starting at the center of the bone to the outer edge of the country ham. I like to slice in the thinnest part of the meat. This should allow the country ham to separate from the bone.
- 4. Place on platter and serve.

Optional Holiday Ham Honey Glaze

- 1/4 cup whole cloves
- 1/4 cup dark corn syrup
- 2 cups of honey
- 3/4 cup butter
- 1. Place ham in foil lines pan. pierce ham and insert cloves.
- 2. Warm and then mix dark corn syrup, butter and honey. (I leave it in corning dish in the oven)
- 3. Brush glaze over the country ham
- 4. Baste again every 10-15 minutes for 1 hour.
- 5. Turn on broiler to caramelize the glaze (4-5 minutes)
